Frog's Life Cycle




Eggs Did you know that the brown tree frog can lay




between 500-700 eggs?



Tadpoles They hatch from the egg after 4-6 days. They stay a tadpole for 5-9 weeks





Froglet (Front & Back Legs) Front legs start to grow at about 9-12 weeks. The froglet will stay in this stage for about 1-2 weeks



Froglet (Back legs) Back legs can start to grow from 5-9 weeks.

Metamorphosis

Metamorphosis is a big change in an animal's body as it grows. It looks very different from when it was a baby to when it is an fully grown. The tadpole metamorphosised into the frog. It had a complete transformation. Arhliya

Camouflage

Frogs can be different colours like green, brown and even red, yellow and blue. They will often camouflage in with things in their tank. Camouflage means they blend in with things in their tank and you can barely see them. Our frogs camouflage with the water, rocks, sand and dirt in our tank. Frogs don't just use their mouth to swallow they also use their eyeballs. too. They do this by retracting their eyeballs into their skulls to help them push food down. Seb

Frogs eat leftover tadpole eggs. Tadpoles have external gills to help them breathe. Their tail gets shorter and shorter as they grow and is absorbed by it's body. Frogs have lungs and breathe through these. Ryder
