

A few key points to note:

- 🕒 Orders must be placed no later than 8:30am on the day.
- 📅 You can pre-order in advance.
- ✅ Our school account is now live, and orders can be placed from today for next Tuesday's trial.
- 👏 We encourage all families who regularly order lunches to participate in the trial next Tuesday, so everyone is ready for the official start in Week 4, 2026.
